Non-negotiable elements

1. **Ordained:** An ordained minister in the Church of the Nazarene
2. **Strategic Thinker:** A strategic thinker capable of implementing the Board of Trustees vision and mandate of transitioning APNTS into a multi-campus extended school utilizing various delivery models that enable extension centers to thrive.
3. **Administrator:** The ability to identify, acquire and guide resources to effective, multi-site strategic use. This would entail the ability to manage finance, operations, campus facilities and environment.
4. **Missional:** A heart for mission and demonstrated missional effectiveness that connects with the students in their places of ministry
5. **Transformational:** A visionary, entrepreneur, team developer, listener, facilitator and one who empowers others. A self-assured transformational pastoral leader who is comfortable with risk-taking and creates positive ethos.
6. **Grace-full:** A proven track record and conceptualization of the place of grace in leadership.

For the future president to be successful in their assignment, the following are:

Necessary elements

1. Proven record of leading complex organizational structures.
2. Ability to network and fund raise.
3. A leader that has both educational, pastoral, and business experience.
4. Cross cultural sensitivity preferably demonstrated, with minimally a capacity to clearly articulate considerations in this area.
5. A clear understanding of the role and place of graduate education.

The term of office will be via a renewable contract, four years in duration, subject to a favorable review every second full year. A negotiated salary and benefits package commensurate with the standing of APNTS as a Global Missions institution will be offered.
